Gregory Hussey is an infectious diseases specialist and is currently the Director of the Institute of Infectious Diseases at the University of Cape Town (UCT). He is also the Deputy Dean for Research in the Faculty of Health Sciences at UCT. For the past 15 years he has been a part-time infectious diseases consultant to the World Health Organisation (WHO) and is currently a member the WHO Global Advisory Committee on Vaccine Safety. He is also a member of a number of important national scientific advisory committees including the National Advisory Group on Immunisation and the Board of National Health Laboratory Services. His research interest is in vaccine preventable diseases and he has over 200 publications to date. He was the founding Director of the South African Tuberculosis Vaccine Initiative based at UCT and he has also facilitated the development of an African TB vaccine research network. His work is supported by a number of agencies including the NIH, Wellcome Trust, EDCTP and the Aeras Global TB Vaccine Foundation.
